They are a very determined and hardworking family. But life has been difficult since the pandemic. They have suffered greatly due to lack of work and have gone to bed hungry many nights. Their young daughter was also just diagnosed with anemia.

## FOOD BAGGING and DISTRIBUTION CAMPAIGN

ACAF staff bagged 300 packages of rice, sugar, beans, oil, pasta, milk and bread and healthy cookies from the Solidaripan bakery and distributed these items to homeless and disabled people living in extreme poverty in the Cambio Puente area. Many of the beneficiaries stood in line all night waiting to receive their package. Tears of relief and joy spread throughout this neighborhood. Over 300 beneficiaries were impacted.







#### **HEALTH and AWARENESS CAMPAIGN**

Continued medical office visits at the Santiago Apostol Hospice Building and in-home visits are taking place with the ACAF contracted doctors

and nurses. X-rays, COVID testing, oxygen treatments, emergency care and medicine distribution are the primary activities. Spreading awareness on the importance of vaccinations and COVID prevention tips are also being shared. At this time 35-40% of Peruvians are fully vaccinated and 50% of the population have received their first dose.



### FAMILY NUTRITION CAMPAIGN

Chefs from the ACAF Culinary program traveled to the San Pedro and Cambio Puente soup kitchens and prepared a nutritious dish of fish in tomato sauce with rice and beans. They also provided instructions on how to make the dish and the health benefits of preparing nutritional meals for their formilies. Over 200

## WATER FOR LIFE CAMPAIGN

60,000 liters of water and nutritional cookies were distributed to over 600 families which impacted over 2,400 beneficiaries in the Cambio Puente neighborhoods.
